

Project: Climate Governance Integrity

Project Title: Ensuring integrity in climate policy-making and in climate finance decision-making and delivery at all levels.

Project Duration: August 2015 to December 2017

Applicant: Transparency International Korea

Major Activities:

1. Attending the GCF Board meetings (live webcast) as an accredited observer
 - Board meeting is being held 3-4 times a year
 - 3 days formal meetings; 1 day informal
 - Note-taking: daily summary reporting/sharing to TI climate team and TI chapters
2. CSOs preparatory meeting
 - 2 days: discussion of items for the Board meeting; preparation of points for interventions; policy proposals preparation; updates from the last Board meeting; in-between decisions of the Board updates
 - 20-30 CSO representative from the global north and global south
3. CSO meetings/discussions and updates:
 - Online: e.g. Skype calls
 - Email updates

Overall Deliverables:

1. Project chapters and TI-S are up-to-date on relevant GCF news, processes and CSO actions, and are able to provide input into TI positions on GCF policy and other relevant decisions in a timely and succinct manner.
2. TI maintains a strong presence in the GCF CSO group and TI positions are communicated to relevant stakeholders in a timely and succinct manner

Other Roles:

1. As Focal Point
 - Sharing information and serving as “help desk” to support chapters in finding information about the GCF, etc.
 - Soliciting and coordinating chapter inputs to calls for inputs
2. Publishing GCF Digest (internal newsletter)
 - A monthly newsletter (last Monday/month)
 - Contents: CSO actions, general news, GCF project pipeline, policy, upcoming meetings and events, chapter story
3. GCF Newsletter (in Korean language)
 - Updates: developments, policies, issues, CSO participation/contributions

National Level CSO Engagement

1. Anti-corruption and accountability rhetoric is part of the agenda of CSOs acting on climate related issues and these CSOs, in collaboration with TI Korea, are proactively pushing for accountability and anti-corruption standards in climate/green finance in Korea

2. University and youth groups in Korea are actively promoting and using the climate finance e-learning course
3. Activities: communication, news/updates, reporting updates of CSOs to TI Secretariat; website updating, social media updating, visiting CSOs/groups/individuals
